

The Schengen Agreement is an agreement between European countries on a policy of opening borders and the free movement of persons between participating countries. Almost 30 countries, including all members of the European Union (except Ireland and the United Kingdom) and three non-EU countries (Iceland, Norway and Switzerland) signed the Schengen Agreement.

The Schengen Area allows free movement of people within the countries participating in the agreement without the need for a passport at the borders. Even if there is no border control, citizens residing in signatory countries must, as a rule, carry a legal identification document, such as an identity card. For tourists from countries not participating in the agreement, proof of identity is always the passport or, in the case of long stay, the legal substitute document, issued by the immigration authorities of one of the countries participating in the agreement.

Brazilian citizens do not need a visa to enter Luxembourg (or any of the European countries that are part of the Schengen area) when they are traveling for tourism and for a maximum of 90 days. But by requirement of the Schengen Agreement, they must carry Travel Insurance with a minimum coverage of € 30,000.00.
